Conference



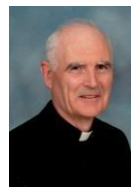
Father Scott Francis Binet is a consecrated religious and family physician. He is Founder and President of the Missionaries of Mercy, a nascent ecclesial family of the Catholic Church. Fr. Binet received his medical degree at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, and completed a residency in Family Practice at St. Joseph's Hospital in Yonkers, NY. In 2003, he professed solemn religious vows in the Ministers of the Infirm (Camillians). From 2004-2011, Fr. Binet was Founder and International Coordinator of the Camillian Task Force, a disaster relief organization. He has done missionary work in Indonesia, Haiti and Sudan. He is past president of the Miami Guild of the Catholic Medical Association, the Region V Co-Director, and recently graduated with distinction from the National Catholic Certification Program in Healthcare Ethics of the National Catholic Bioethics Center.



Dr. Fok-Han Leung is a family physician practicing general family medicine and inner city health out of St. Michael's Hospital in Toronto. He is also the Associate Course Director of CPPD (Community, Population and Public Health – undergraduate medical course), and the Associate Program Director (Evaluation and Assessment) for the University of Toronto family medicine residency. He has been teaching medical students, residents and international graduates for the past 10 years.



Dr. Stephen Genuis is a clinician and researcher. He is board certified in both Obstetrics and Gynecology as well as in Environmental Medicine and has authored over 100 scientific publications for over 50 different peer-review medical journals including Lancet, British Medical Journal and Canadian Medical Association Journal. He lectures extensively and has reviewed papers for over 70 different scientific and medical publications on issues ranging from medical ethics to environmental health, from evidence-based medicine to nutritional science, and from physician professionalism to medicine and cyberspace. Most importantly, he enjoys ballroom dancing with his wife Shelagh, and being his five kids' "Pa".



Father Jack Gallagher was born on a farm in eastern Saskatchewan and ordained a Basilian priest in 1960. He obtained his BA and Master in Philosophy from the University of Toronto, and his Doctorate in Moral Theology from Alfonsian Academy in Rome. He has taught moral theology at numerous university institutions including St. Michael's College in Toronto and the University of St. Thomas in Houston, Texas. He has served as director at the Cardinal Centre for Bioethics, Superior General of the Basilian Fathers, Dean of Theology and most recently, president of Newman College in Edmonton. He is currently the associate pastor at St. Alphonsus and St. Clare parishes in Edmonton. His publications include *The Basis Christian Ethics; Is the Human Embryo a Person? And several articles, most recently "Not in Our Name"*

Speakers



Stephanie Gray is an international speaker and debater who began presenting at the age of 18. She has given over 700 pro-life presentations across North America as well as in the United Kingdom, Ireland, Austria, Latvia, Guatemala, and Costa Rica. She has also done hundreds of media interviews, which include being on CTV, CBC, Global, EWTN, and Catholic Answers Radio. Stephanie is author of *Love Unleashes Life: Abortion & the Art of Communicating Truth* as well as *A Physician's Guide to Discussing Abortion*. She holds a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from UBC in Vancouver, and a Certification, with Distinction, in Health Care Ethics, from the National Catholic Bioethics Center in Philadelphia. Stephanie lives in Vancouver and speaks on behalf of her ministry Love Unleashes Life.



Larry Worthen is the Executive Director of the Christian Medical and Dental Society, one of three physician's organizations which together represent 5,000 physicians across Canada. Larry brings decades of experience working with the homeless, people with mental health difficulties, the elderly, sick and dying during a 15 year career with various NGOs. During a 12 year career in the Nova Scotia government, he led human rights and educational initiatives to improve workplace culture. He holds an LLB and an MA in Theology and is an ordained deacon in the Catholic Church. Larry did his articles with Legal Aid Manitoba in The Pas in the early eighties. Larry is married to Dr. Linda Gagnon and has two married children and three grandchildren. Larry and Linda reside in Dartmouth, NS.



Quentin Genuis is currently doing his clerkship training in the faculty of medicine at the University of Alberta. With a research focus in bioethics, he also holds a Master of Letters (Nov 2015) with distinction from the University of St. Andrews in Scotland. His research interests include issues of human dignity, end-of-life care, virtue ethics, and autonomy language in contemporary bioethics. He is a published author in peer-reviewed journals in the fields of both medical science and bioethics. Notable awards include the Dr. and Mrs. Hazen Hakinson Dean's Undergraduate Citation in Medicine from the University of Alberta, and the Dr. Ernest L. Ransome III Scholarship—a full-funding award given to three North American postgraduate students who display academic excellence and exceptional leadership.
